That's what Al Daniels was thinking when he chose O'Brien and Sons to build his showcase playground at Normandy Farms Resort in the town of Foxboro, MA. The Daniels family began farming this land more than 200 years ago, but in 1972 they decided to create a campground on the site to bring in extra income. Today, Normandy Farms is one of the largest and most successful family camping resorts in North America. Amenities abound, including a golf course, recreation center, swimming pools, fishing and on site craft classes.

A larger PlayBooster playsystem for children ages 512 features a brilliant red barn roof complete with a
crowing rooster in the loft and a cow peering over the
barn door. The play structure is dominated by the red and
green colors that not only reinforce the farm theme, but
also are the perfect complement to the surrounding trees.
Exceptional play value was created by integrating five large
slides into the perimeter of the play structure, including a
twin-bed Gemini slide, a 360-degree Turbo Twister
Tunnel Slide and a Double Swoosh Slide.
Three large octagonal decks serve as gathering points
for kids, one of which is capped by a custom-made

silo-shaped roof.

According to Daniels the playground has been a huge hit with kids and parents alike ever since they opened the play area on Labor Day weekend. "The sheer size and magnitude of the playground and the appeal of the farm theme have really kept our new play area busy," says Daniels. "Kids love the challenging selection of play events that we included, and we're noticing that parents seem to really enjoy watching the kids play. This spring we plan to add lighting, extra seating, and a pair of gazebos adjacent to the play area. We wanted a playground that would encourage our customers to come back again, and I would certainly say that we've achieved that."

To reinforce the heritage of the 100-acre site, Al and Doris Daniels chose to build their new playground with a farm theme.

"We generally don't do things half way," said
Daniels. "And this project was no different. We wanted
our new playground to be something that kids will
remember, something that will keep the kids and their
moms and dads coming back to Normandy Farms.
O'Brien and Sons and Landscape Structures had the
vision to design a completely unique playground for us
—one that we were sure kids had never seen in their city
park or at their school. I think we accomplished that with
this farm theme."

Nancy White from O'Brien & Sons, the Massachusetts representative for Landscape Structures, spearheaded the project, which relied on custom-designed architectural elements to capture the look and feeling of a farm. First the 85 ft. by 150 ft. site was divided into two age-appropriate play areas. Next, they set about creating the visual elements of a farmyard.
